Emergency Contact Cards/ Early Dismissal

All students will be given **two** Department of Education Emergency Cards. Please complete cards and return immediately. Your contact person must have current phone numbers. Please keep the school informed of your current address and phone number as emergencies sometimes arise which require the attention of a parent and/or guardian. Emergency Contact Cards are kept on file in the main office, the medical room, and the child's classroom. It is imperative that information on these cards be **kept accurate and up to date.**

Please make it a priority to come to the main office to update the blue card if you change your phone number.

Please be mindful that for safety purposes:

- Only people listed on your child's blue card will be allowed to escort your child home, as we will not take verbal permission over the phone.
- Anyone other than a parent who is picking up, may not sign the child out of school early, even if they are on the blue card. We require a note from the parent giving permission for early pick up.
- Only the parent or legal guardian can add a person to the blue card.
- We will **not** release your child to anyone listed on the blue card that does **not have** proper identification.
- Students will not be released to a minor (Anyone under the age of 18)
- All students who are being picked up from the main office must be signed out.
- Please contact the school, if you know you will be running late for pick up.

School Security/Visitors

To ensure the safety of our entire school community, in order to enter the building, visitors **MUST** present photo identification to the school safety agent and sign in at the desk .



School Buses

Only eligible students are permitted to ride the school bus. Children in Grades K-2 living a 1/2 mile or more from the school and students in Grades 3-5 living 1 mile or more are eligible for bus service. Please make sure an adult is there each day on time to pick up your child from the bus stop. Please note, the drivers cannot wait at any given stop, as they follow a schedule for pick up and drop off. Please remind your child about bus safety. All children should remain in their seats, with their seatbelts on at all times while the bus is moving. During our Bus Safety Drills, students are also reminded about bus behavior, and what to do in an emergency. Students are subject to all bus safety rules and regulations as outlined in The Chancellor's Regulations A-801.

If your child is not riding the bus on any given day, a written letter must be submitted to the teacher or the main office must be notified via phone by noon of that day. Please make sure you speak to someone directly, and do not leave a voicemail, as that message may not be received in time for bus pick up.

Homework Policy

Homework is an extension of the learning that takes place in school. Homework provides practice that reinforces classroom learning and can provide opportunities for independent study, research and creative thinking. Parents can help their children by providing a quiet, comfortable place for children to work. Parents should also follow up on assignments to ensure that they are completed. Please make sure that you check and sign all homework.

The following guidelines are suggested for each grade level on a daily basis:

Kindergarten	10-15 minutes
Grades 1 & 2	30 minutes
Grades 3, 4 & 5	40 minutes

If you find it is taking your child longer than the above mentioned time, please do not hesitate to reach out their teacher.

Birthday Celebrations

Birthdays in K-2 may only be celebrated in the classroom at 1:45 pm. In order to maximize instructional time and minimize interruptions, prior approval from the classroom teacher is needed. In grades 3, 4 and 5 birthdays will be celebrated once a month. Please consult with your child's teacher.

Please note, we do not allow siblings to be pulled from instruction to attend parties.

Emergency Drills

Evacuation Drills, Shelter–In, Lockdown Drills & Hold Drills are held at regular intervals. Students are taught the necessary precautions to take in the event of an emergency and the appropriate behavior to be used during the drill.

Medical Room Procedures

First aid is administered in the medical office located on the third floor. Parents will be contacted either by phone or letter (depending on the severity of the illness) when a child is seen by the nurse. According to the Department of Education policy, students may only be given medication by the school nurse if the **Medication Administration Form** (504) has been completed and is on file. This form is available for any child who needs to be administered medication during the school day. Under no circumstances will a child be permitted to carry medicine in school.

Cell Phone Policy

Cell phones may not be turned on or used: During instructional time, or during the school day.

Cell phones may be used:

At the conclusion of after school or school sponsored activities.

Please note that **smart watches** of any kind are also considered cell phones, are not permitted in school during the instructional day.

The complete cell phone policy will be distributed at the beginning of the school year.

As always, if you have any questions or concerns, or require assistance, please do not hesitate to reach out.

Please make sure your contact information is up-to-date. Sign in to your New York City Schools Account (NYCSA). It is imperative that all students have an open NYCSA Account, as all important documents, grades and attendance records are located here. You can also log into your NYCSA Account to access Parent University. Parent University is designed to empower you as an advocate and partner in your child's education.

Attendance

As part of the **Chancellor's Regulation A-210**, we are required to know why a child is absent from school. Therefore, parents are asked to submit a note to their child's teacher stating the reason for the absence from school. Please note that absent notes are for record keeping purposes. If your child will be out more than two days, please call and let us know. Also keep in mind that school begins promptly at **8:00AM** and children who arrive after that time will be marked officially late.

Please note that absence and lateness will be reflected on your child's report card.

Benefits of good attendance:

1. Attendance and academic achievement go hand in hand.

2. Making school attendance a priority can also help your child acquire excellent work and study habits.

3. Getting to school each day prepares students to meet future responsibilities.

4. The same holds true for getting to school on time. Parents teach a valuable lesson when they teach the importance of arriving to school on time every day.

All students are expected to achieve **90% attendance.** This equals only nine days of excused absences.

All late students must be brought into the main entrance to have a late pass filled out and signed by a parent / guardian.
