What We're Learning

Math

In Math, students will learn to compare and measure length, identifying the shortest and longest objects using various tools. They will also explore time to the hour and half hour on both analog and digital clocks. Students will work with money, identifying coins and combining values up to one dollar.

Social Studies

In Social Studies, students will understand their role as a citizen. They will explore rules and laws and ensuring fairness within communities. They will learn how laws are created, why they are necessary, and how they impact individuals and society as a whole.

Reading

In reading, students will explore classic tales and stories while learning about storytellers from the past and present. They will build an understanding of the lessons stories can teach, such as the importance of persevering and not giving up when things are difficult.

Writing

In Writing, students will create a story about an important person in their life. They will focus on a problem they faced and explain how this person helped them solve it. Their story will include a clear beginning, middle, and end.
