We Will Learn...

Reading:

Over the next three weeks, our class will build their knowledge about people who make their communities better and stronger, with a focus on the narrative nonfiction genre. We will read texts about individuals and groups that make a difference in their local or global communities. We will also write an expository essay that explains how one person can have an impact and make a meaningful difference in a community.

Math:

Next month, students will focus on Topic 14, which extends their understanding of time and measurement. They will learn to tell time on analog clocks and solve word problems involving elapsed time. Students will also measure liquid volume in liters and estimate mass in grams and kilograms, applying these concepts through real-life examples. By connecting math to everyday experiences, such as identifying time or estimating weight at home, students will enhance their practical understanding of these topics.
