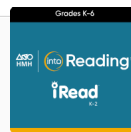

### What we're learning

#### Math

In Math this month, students will understand that the equal sign indicates that both sides of an equation represent the same value. Students will determine whether addition and subtraction equations are true or false, they will find the missing number in addition and subtraction equations and learn how to equations with three addends.

#### Social Studies

In Social Studies this month, students will learn about what a tradition is, and how different families have different values that are set in their home. Students will take all their information they have collected and create a quilt that represents their family.

#### Reading

In Reading this month, students will discover facts about animals as they read both nonfiction and fiction books. They will learn how animals build homes for protection and learn about characteristics of animals that help them grow and survive in the natural world.
