INTRODUCTION

NYC Reads is New York City Public School's strategy for whole school literacy reform, including shifts in approach and practice around assessment systems, core curriculum and instruction and intervention. We are committed to supporting all students to become strong, thriving readers. The Literacy Collaborative team, along with the Division of Multilingual Learners and the Division of Special Education have developed a **guidance document** with resources to support initial implementation.

To ensure students' success within NYC Reads, family engagement will play a crucial role. This document offers suggestions for districts and schools to engage and support families to be a part of this process.

What do families need to know about the science of reading?

- The science of reading is a broad collection of research focused on helping children become better readers and writers. It explores five important components of reading: understanding letter sounds, decoding words, building vocabulary, reading fluently and comprehending what you read. This approach involves teaching step-by-step in a clear and organized way, ensuring that all students receive the support they need to succeed.
- Science of reading isn't just a passing trend or a one-size-fits-all approach. It's not tied to a specific teaching program, and it's not just about phonics. Instead, it's a proven method based on science and research that benefits all types of learners.

INTRODUCTION

What do families need to know about assessments this year?

- Our assessment framework focuses on remedying existing learning difficulties and preventing potential difficulties through data-based decision-making.
- All students will be administered a universal screener three times per year.
 - Acadience Reading is the required screener in K-2, available for K-5.
 - MAP Growth is approved for reading in 3-10; Spanish Reading K-8.
 - STAR Reading is approved for reading in 3-10; Spanish Reading K-10.
 - iReady is approved for reading in 3-10.
 - Degrees of Reading Power is approved for reading in 3-10.
- All core curriculum programs provide curriculum-based assessments. Formative and summative assessments are both included.
 - Formative assessments monitor student learning so teachers can identify students' needs.
 - Summative assessments evaluate student learning at the end of an instructional unit.


