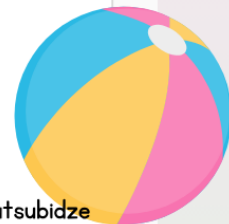

What We're Learning

Math

In Math this month, students will learn defining and non-defining attributes of 2-D and 3-D shapes. Students will put together various shapes to make composite shapes. They will gain an understanding of fractions by partitioning circles and rectangles into two or four equal shares.

Social Studies

In Social Studies, students will learn about economics and how people have wants and needs. We will also learn about producers and consumers, the difference between goods and services, and how people work, spend, and save money to meet their needs and wants.

Reading

In Reading, students will explore classic tales and stories while learning about storytellers from the past and present. They will build an understanding of the lessons stories can teach, such as the importance of persevering and not giving up when things are difficult.

Writing

In Writing, students will create a folktale about a character who faces a problem and solves it with the help of a friend. Their story will include a clear beginning, middle, and end, as well as dialogue that brings the characters and events to life.
