In the Classroom

Reading : Students will wrap up Module 3 "Rise to The Occasion" and begin Module 4: "Heroic Feats" where they will be analyzing our essential question: What makes someone a hero? Students will be reading a variety of selections that present them with examples of what makes someone a hero. As they read the students will learn that with personal courage and confidence, people can face any challenge.

Writing: Students will continue to write informative, engaging pieces that highlight different aspects of Iroquois life. As part of this unit, students will learn how to use text features such as headings, captions, and sidebars, along with photos and illustrations, to create magazine-style articles that truly immerse the reader.

Math: This month, students will begin the geometry unit, where they will learn to identify and use formulas to find perimeter and area while solving real-world problems. Students will also develop an understanding that geometric figures can be analyzed and classified based on their properties, such as having parallel or perpendicular sides, specific angle measures, and symmetry.
