In the Classroom

Reading: Students will continue Module 6: “Marvels of Nature” where they will be analyzing our essential question: *What makes Earth’s natural wonders exciting and unique?* Toward the end of the month students will begin Module 7 “Tricksters and Tall Tales” where they will be analyzing the essential question: *What lessons can you learn from characters in traditional tales?*

Writing: This month, students will take part in an interdisciplinary unit that connects writing and social studies. In Social Studies, they will explore key events of the American Revolution and examine how those events influenced the founding of the United States. To enhance their learning, students will listen to selected songs from the Broadway musical Hamilton, demonstrating how history can be understood through creative forms like music and poetry. Using what they have learned, students will then create their own parody songs that teach others about important events from the American Revolution, combining historical knowledge with creative expression.

Math: The students will begin Topic 12 which will focus on developing an understanding of decimals and decimal notation by connecting fractions and decimals.
