In the Classroom

Reading: Students began Module 3: "Rise to The Occasion" where they will be analyzing our essential question: *What does it take to meet a challenge?* Students will be reading a variety of selections with characters who are facing a challenge and discussing how they used: bravery, persistence and hard work to overcome them.

Writing: Students will research and write informative, engaging pieces that highlight different aspects of Iroquois life, including: where they lived, what they ate, their clothing, and their hobbies and traditions. As part of this unit, students will learn how to use text features such as headings, captions, and sidebars, as well as photos and illustrations, to create a magazine-style article that truly immerses the reader.

Math: Students will begin working in Topic 5, where they will use mental math and the partial quotients strategy to divide multi-digit dividends. They will also analyze word problems to determine how to interpret and use remainders in real-world situations.
